## Resurfacing Project to Resume on Multiple Routes in Derry Township, Dauphin County

**Harrisburg, PA**- The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today that a resurfacing project on Route 39 (Hershey Park Drive), Route 322 (Governor Road), Route 743 (Fishburn Road/Cocoa Avenue) and Route 2011 (Fishburn Road/Hockersville Road/Swatara Avenue) in Derry Township, Dauphin County, is set to resume next week. This project began last year and is expected to be completed this spring.

Weather permitting, work will begin Monday, March 24. The contractor will work during the overnight hours from 6:00 PM to 6:00 AM to complete base repairs, milling, final paving and line painting.

Most of this remaining work will be on Governor Road east of Centerview Drive, Fishburn Avenue and Cocoa Avenue. All work west of the intersection of Governor Road and Centerview Drive has been completed.

This project consists of resurfacing, base repairs, drainage replacement, guiderail upgrades, ADA curb ramp upgrades, line painting, sign updates, and other miscellaneous construction.

The project limits on Route 39 (Hershey Park Drive) begins at the intersection with Walton Avenue, continues east until it turns into Route 322 (Governor Road) and then continues east to the intersection with Homestead Road.

Work on Route 743 (Fishburn Road/Cocoa Avenue) begins at the intersection with Homestead Road and continues north to the intersection with Route 322 (Governor Road). Work on Route 2011 (Fishburn Road/Hockersville Road/Swatara Avenue) begins at the intersection with Route 743 (Cocoa Avenue) and continues north to the intersection with Old West Chocolate Avenue. The overall project length is 5.8 miles.

Pennsy Supply, Inc., of Harrisburg is the contractor on this \$4,999,986 project. All work is expected to be completed by May 31, 2025.
